Campus Care Alliance Report for Resident Council 26 Mar 2016

Our committee last met on March 17th with 16 members and 6 staff members.

The March staff reports from Josh Hillegass and Rachel Seibert, DON, were not only interesting but illustrate how well this nursing team works together.

1. They are trying their best to make improvements in many areas of the CWC experience. For example, they are interviewing patients and staff, if response times are slow, to clear up problems. There have been some helpful changes made to the HOST program also.

2. To improve communications, staff introduce themselves when they enter patient rooms, and will wear new uniforms, navy for RN's and gray for CNA's, to differentiate themselves for the patients.

3. Another important improvement is having the Staff Development Coordinator, Christine, Director of Nursing, Rachel, and Assistant Director of Nursing Amanda conduct one-on-one education sessions with new nurses.

4. Assisted Living Manager Ginger Cottrell is currently working to improve socialization among the patients by implementing monthly socials for men and women, and finding ways to improve physical health and activities.

The committee feels that there should be more emphasis on the CARE awards given out at Resident Council. These awards distinguish a caregiver for demonstrating the 4 pillars of care: compassion, advocacy, respect, and excellence. You receive a copy of the CARE award nomination form in your admission packets, and in the monthly Chitchat, with a full description of the requirements written by Sarah Hester. These forms are also available on Uniguest. You can submit the nomination form at the CWC main desk, and to Josh, Rachel or Karla Stapleton.

Remember: Nominations can be done by any WS resident, CWC resident, family members, or by the person's department head.

The two completed post-discharge surveys were very positive in all respects, though they both complained about their room temperature at times. They would definitely recommend WS.

Jimmie Dowless opened the meeting with a prayer.

It is requested that when you speak at the meeting, please identify yourself so minutes will be correct.

Brightview:

Greg and James represented Brightview. Mulch and pine needles will be applied by the end of March.

Herbicide will be applied for the turf. This will include fertilizer and pre-emergent to maintain the turf.

Barbara Doughton expressed concern about spraying lawns due to concern for pets. Jimmie explained that we switched from Roundup to Ranger Pro and that the switch was approved by our committee at our October 13, 2025 meeting. Spraying is spot spraying, not blanket spraying. For pet safety, it is recommended to wait 30-60 minutes after application. Joel will send out a letter advising residents about our spraying procedure including an opt-out provision.

Old Business:

A resident questioned how often dryer vents were supposed to be cleaned. Dryer vent cleaning will be scheduled in April. We will use in-house cleaning of dryer vents to avoid billing residents. Joel is working on this project.

New Business:

A discussion was held concerning a bill from Brightview for cleaning up of two winter events. Brightview contracted St. Patrick's for their end of the job (The Village) but Whitestone maintenance cleaned up everything else. The bill for \$185,000 was reduced to \$145,00 after questioning by Whitestone. Mark talked to the LCS group purchasing company, who recommended Brightview, about this extravagant charge. Brightview was considered a preferred vendor. Bryant Webster, an attorney on the Whitestone

board, has been contacted about this issue. We will be soliciting bids for alternate landscaping services companies.

Jimmie received an email from a resident concerning grounds maintenance and this item will be discussed with Brightview by Joel, Donna and himself before being brought back to the committee if necessary.

Jimmie received a message from Dan Miller, who is in Room 612 in CWC, that the gutter over the window of his room has apparently stopped up with rain overflowing that might damage the building foundation or destroy any landscaping in front of the window. Joel will take care of this issue. Mark suggested a proposal for gutter guard to be put in next year's budget.

This issue was reported to Jimmie by a resident. The Holden Road entry to Whitestone is not very well lit. There is one city streetlight near it, but that light is obscured by an overhanging tree (soon to be in full leaf). The Whitestone lamp inside the fence has a downward shade and does not help. Driving south, through the second underpass means it is hard to see the driveway... especially in December and January during outgoing traffic around 6 or 6:30. I was almost rear ended and the Uber driver, bringing us home around 10 last Saturday, missed the driveway altogether.

As a result of the recent snowstorms, we have been asked to explore ideas of anything that we think might be any possible improvements that may help our community in preparation for future situations.

For example, the security building at front gate could be without power and would be without heat or AC, control of gates, no ability to monitor security cameras. If you have any ideas, please email Jimmie and he will compile a list, looking at both pros and cons and bring it back to committee for our input and recommended actions.

Plant Operations Report:

Do we have an update on the buffet project in the dining room? Previously, completion was expected in April or May. This time frame is still correct.

Do we have an update on fiber project? We are looking at an April-May completion.

Work Order report for February 2026? We had 675 work orders from February 1-March 1. We are in the process of moving supplies to Gay Terrace.

On March 20 th, maintenance will be conducting a detailed generator review where power will be switched to generator for roughly 30 min to an hour. Maintenance wants to determine exactly what circuits are on the generator. They will be entering apartments to

verify and label critical outlets with red stickers which will eventually be changed to red outlet covers. Just an FYI, the new generator services CWC only. AL and MC are hooked up to the IL generator.

Environmental Services Report:

Since the last meeting, we have changed window cleaning chemicals and have gotten positive feedback on that.

A list of services that are to be done by cleaning staff in individual residences is ready and will be reviewed by a committee before making it public.

We are starting a trash service for the villa homes where we pull the trash cans to the curb on Mondays and Wednesdays after 2:30pm and then returning them after trash has been collected, starting this week.

The meeting was adjourned.

Our next meeting is April 13, 2026.

Seven Committee members and the president and vice president of Resident Council attended the meeting on March 2, 2026. All residents are encourage to join the committee and volunteer to further the cause of recycling at WhiteStone.

Amelia Caison reported that she weighs plastic film and take it to Food Lion but she needs help transporting bags from collection points. Betsy Schiller noted that most film collected is acceptable. We've gathered about 600 pounds of plastic bags/film; we need 400 more by June 5th. More volunteers are needed to helped collect through April.

Ed Walker has asked Archana Patel for one more blue bin to collect aluminum cans for recycling and place it in the Rotunda. On IL4 South, recycling contamination remains high, especially with clam shells and misplaced plastic film as well as glass. Styrofoam recycling continues with bins on the second and fourth floors of IL West and IL South. Plastic bags are not to be placed in these bins.

The Lunch and Learn is scheduled for April 9th, from 12–1:30 pm. This will be an opportunity to enjoy a lunch prepared by our Food Services and to learn more about recycling with demonstrations and prizes. The session should be recorded and replayed Friday at 6:30 PM. Attendees reviewed these topics, discussed changes to Film collection rules, and suggested recording/replaying Lunch and Learn.

There were recommendations to combine efforts with Building and Grounds, and to explore composting and raising chickens.

- Plan to collect MAC addresses and AP/IP information and submit to vendor; new ticket opened Friday.
- Spectrum analyzer to be used to measure low signal strength; masonry building may degrade internal Wi Fi; some Canon printers show delayed or sporadic printing. I noticed that Mac Books have a particularly hard time staying connected to Canon printers even with a direct connection using cable.

Healthcare signups & Curana integration

- 74 residents signed up for primary care with Curana and 38 for acute care; enrollment continues to grow from new move ins and short term stay transfers.
- access to EPIC; the Care Everywhere tab displays encounter notes and basic summaries from Atrium, Novant, and other practices.
- Stephanie, the WhiteStone nurse practitioner, was permanently assigned to the community; residents reported positive experiences and positive feedback for onsite phlebotomy.
- Behavioral health contract with Curana was signed on February 23; services include psychiatrist, psychologist, talk therapist, virtual and in person visits (therapists have visited apartments), and medication management; services are billed under Curana,.
- COVID booster clinic scheduled for April 21, 10:00 am–3:00 pm for independent living; Resident Health Services exam room (Tatiana) is available for residents who prefer clinic visits; repeated requests for toenail cutting were raised and require follow up.
